National Road Alliance plans tour

The National Road Alliance and each of the National Road states, including Indiana, are planning a cross state antique car tour.

The national seven-day tour begins May 1 in Vandalia, Ill., and ends in Cumberland, Md. The tour makes several stops in Indiana, including three in Wayne County, on May 3.

The tour coincides with the bicentennial of the groundbreaking of the National Road, which was one of the first major highways funded by the federal government.

Indiana's portion of the tour starts May 2, but the caravan does not reach Wayne County until noon May 3.

The first stop is at the Pour House at the Huddleston Farmhouse. The caravan is expected to arrive at 1:15 p.m. at the Vinton House in Cambridge City for antique shopping. The last stop is expected to take place at 3 p.m. at the Wayne County Historical Museum.

As the caravan of cars crosses each state, the lead vehicle will carry a set of bells that will be handed off from state to state and presented to the City of Cumberland, Md. at its May 7-8 celebration. The bells represent the bells that hung from oxen harnesses pulling wagons.

The tour's conclusion will be marked with the sealing of a new time capsule in Cumberland.
