He walks in memory of his wife Joan Chermack Brown, who died from ovarian cancer in 2011. An avid walker. Brown decided he wanted to walk the National Road after his wife gave him a copy of a book by Thomas R. Vale titled US 40 Today: Thirty Years of Landscape Change in America. He began walking from Atlantic City, NJ on February 28, 2013 and will continue his walk to San Francisco, CA on the National Road (US Route 40) and US Route 50 to raise awareness about ovarian cancer and raise funds for ovarian cancer research. He averages 14 miles a day and plans to reach his final destination on Columbus Day, October 14, 2013. 


## **Milestone Awards Presented**

## **National Road Ramblings**



The Black Horse Inn in Morristown.

A recent eastern end Road trip revealed some disheartening discoveries concerning several structures and areas. The Black Horse Inn at Morristown continues to deteriorate as it awaits new ownership. We are told the current asking price is around \$25K, so if any of you are seeking a project, this imperiled property will more than fill the bill. The brick drover's tavern west of Morristown (shown in our Fall 2012 newsletter) is awaiting demolition, even though it continued to self-demolish in spite of itself just a few weeks ago. Here's an observation on parts of the National Register historic district within Morristown itself. The level of deferred maintenance overall in numerous properties within the core of the town continues to discourage those of us interested in historic preservation, although private property preservation cannot be mandated. Sometimes disappointment reigns supreme.
